

# **Call for Applications: Consultant: External Impact Assessment of Project**

**We encourage applications from trans, gender diverse, and intersex people, Black, indigenous, and Latinx people and people of color, D/deaf, and disabled people, people from a migrant background, and sex workers.**

## **Background**

GATE is concluding a multi-year project with 7 partner organizations in 7 countries (Thailand, Cambodia, Ukraine, Uganda, Kenya, Zambia, and Tanzania) across various international regions. All partners have the capacity to communicate in English. The focus of the project is to:

- Amplify the participation and voice of trans and gender diverse communities in policy and decision-making fora and in governance and stewardship of national HIV responses;
- Strengthen the influence of trans and gender diverse communities in the design and implementation of national HIV strategies so that they adequately reflect and respond to community realities and needs.
- Strengthen community-led organizations and their ability to conduct advocacy for legal recognition and access to health rights for trans and gender diverse persons and
- Produce knowledge and resources for use in evidence-based advocacy.

## **Objectives**

We are seeking to engage an experienced consultant to conduct an external review of the project in order to assess the impact of the project, document the successes, challenges, and lessons learned during the implementation of the project, and make recommendations on strengthening future projects.

## **Scope of Work**

The consultant will collaborate with GATE team members to develop a detailed project methodology and tools, review project documentation, conduct interviews with partner organizations, donor representatives, and other key informants, and develop an impact assessment report on the project.

## **Responsibilities**

- Review project reports;
- Review project publications and products;
- Conduct interviews with key informants;
- Develop a draft evaluation report for review by the GATE team and
- Submit a final report within the project timeline.

## **Essential Requirements**

- Experience in conducting reviews and evaluations of human rights and health advocacy projects;
- Knowledge of international HIV response mechanisms;
- Knowledge of the Global Fund, particularly country processes
- A deep understanding of the health and human rights issues impacting trans and gender diverse communities;

- Strong written and verbal communication skills and experience in report writing.
- Experience in working with civil society organizations at national and regional levels and
- Knowledge of the policies and processes of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria.
